Thank you for your interest in The Horsemanship School, LLC. I am the principal member of the school, the herd manager and one of the instructors. My name is Dawn Sandiford-Stahr. I've ridden, owned, trained and taught others about horses and ponies for over 40 years. I thoroughly enjoy sharing the knowledge and experience I've acquired along the way. In the recent past, I was the lead pony program instructor at Redmond Parks & Recreation's Farrel-McWhirter Park for 4 years. The Horsemanship School was founded in 1999 from my passions for horses, children and teaching, and by my pony program students' desire for "more". My co-instructor, Cydney Adler, has also been involved with horses and riding since she was a child. She shares my Horsemanship School passion and is especially talented in starting the little ones. Cyd is also the director of our Spring and Summer Camp Programs and is the advisor for our Junior Horsemasters Club. We both hold CHA certification.

Our equine herd consists of a dozen small, medium, large, and extra large size ponies. We can accommodate children from 4 years old up to small size adults. Our mission is to teach excellent HORSEMANSHIP; the whys and hows of working SAFELY around these wonderful animals. We turn out knowledgeable beginning to intermediate level riders in both the English and Western styles..

Weekly hour long lessons are scheduled in sessions of approximately 8 weeks. Classes are made up of 4 to 6 student with similar experience. Private lessons are available. Once a student is riding with us, they have first priority as to continuing in an appropriate class for each succeeding session. If they decide to stop riding, the spot is filled from our waiting list and that student moves into the priority position.

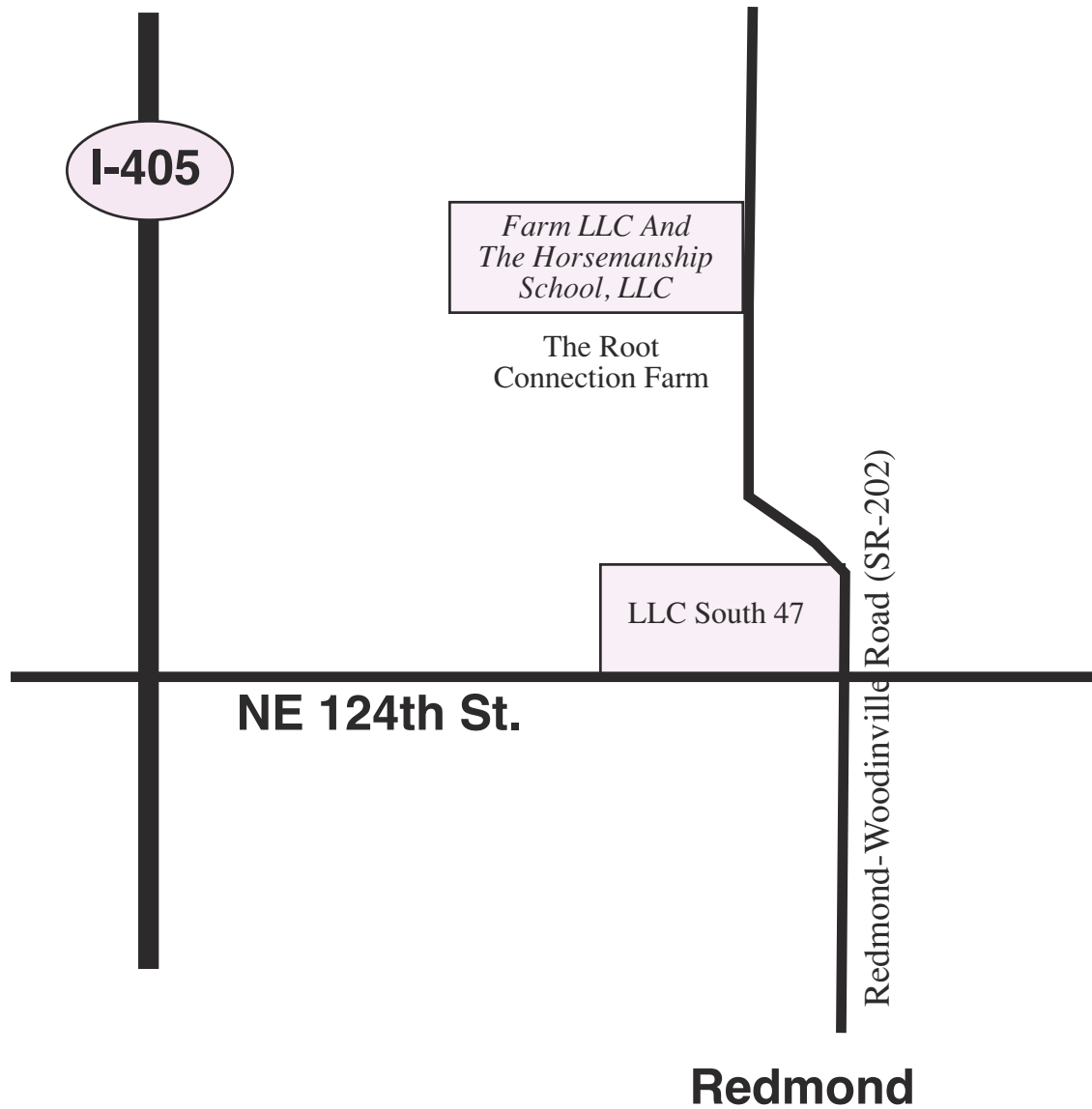
General Information For A Safe & Happy Riding Experience

- **Classes Are Held Rain or Shine. We Have Indoor As Well As Outdoor Facilities For Grooming and Riding. Dress For The Weather!**
- **A Medical Information Form and Waiver of Liability Permission Slip Must Be Signed By A Parent or Guardian For Each Student Prior To Their First Class.**
- **No One But THS Staff And Helmeted Participants Are Allowed In The Barn.**
- **Riding Helmets Are Mandatory When Working Around Or Riding The Horses and Ponies. Put Them On As You Enter The Barn! NO EXCEPTIONS! We Recommend That You Wear An ASTM /SEI Approved Riding Helmet. You May Bring Your Own Helmet Or Borrow One From Us. Wear A Simple Hairdo With No “Bobbles” To Interfere With Helmet Fit, Comfort and Safety.**
- **Wear Comfortable Long Pants, Tops With Covered Shoulders and Solid Toed, Smooth Soled Boots With Heels. No Shorts or Capris. No Tank Tops. No Tennis Shoes, Hiking Boots or Sandals. Riding Gloves Are Helpful. Dress For The Weather!**
- **No Dogs Or Other Pets Are Allowed Near The Horses and Ponies.**
- **PLEASE, NO FLASH CAMERAS, Balloons, Umbrellas, Strollers or Backpacks are Allowed Near The Barn Or Where The Students Are Riding. They May Spook The Horses. Observation Of The Class Is Encouraged, But Observers Must Be Quiet At All Times.**
- **THS Staff Reserves The Right To Decide When And If A Student’s Behavior and/or Attitude Becomes Unsafe For The Student To Continue Lessons/Classes or Camps at The Horsemanship School.**
